ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:

The Calgary Jewish Hockey League (CJHL) was established in 1978 by Larry Katz and Lloyd Ashkin, with Allan (Curly) Gurevitch serving as league commissioner. The league started with four teams and over 60 players, including one woman. The teams, which later numbered six, were sponsored by local Jewish businesses, and used volunteer referees, score and time keepers. A Calgary "all-star" team, made up primarily of players from the various Calgary Jewish Hockey League teams, participated in the1982 B'nai Brith National Hockey Championship tournament in Winnipeg. By the 2000-2001 season, teams were identified by their captain's name.

SCOPE AND CONTENT:

The fonds consists of Calgary Jewish Hockey League booklets containing schedules, rosters and rules, as well as completed score sheets, newsletters, stationery (letterhead & envelopes, blank score sheets, receipts) a 1979 financial statement, a 1979 awards banquet ticket, press releases, a program from the 1982 B'nai Brith National Hockey Championship, and a photocopied program for the 1984 B'nai Brith Drei Kop invitational Hockey Tournament. Also included are a 2" diameter round metal pin and a nylon hockey jersey.
