ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY

Since pre-WWI, the Calgary Jewish community had a number of iterations of a community council, all of which concerned themselves with the establishment of a range of community institutions and organizations. Beginning in 1929, the focal point for many of these activities was the House of Israel community building on 18th Ave, but the overall organizational structure was inconsistent. Jewish Community Council of Calgary (later Calgary Jewish Federation) was "newly formed" in 1965, and one of their first projects was to develop a "structured program to serve the recreational and leisure time needs" of the community. After a series of meetings with the leadership of community centres in other cities, a Calgary workshop was held in April 1965. Under Community Council Executive Director Harry Shatz, an operational Standing Committee established and ran a "demonstration" program in the fall and winter of 1965/1966, with regular programming beginning in the fall of 1966. Many activities, which focused on children and teens, took place at the House of Israel. The facilities at a nearby Boys Club were rented for basketball, volleyball and other gym activities, while swimming lessons were held at a city-run pool in the district of Killarney.

By 1967 planning had begun for a new community centre, and in 1970 the Community Council purchased land at the corner of 14th St. and 90th Ave SW. With funding assistance from the Province of Alberta, the Calgary Jewish Centre – variously called the Jewish Centre, the Community Centre, the Centre, or the JCC – opened in June, 1979. The facility included meeting rooms, an auditorium, a gymnasium and a pool, as well as a chapel, a library, a youth lounge and a kosher café; a breezeway connected the JCC to an adjacent seniors' apartment building (later the Bertha Gold Jewish Seniors Residence). A 1992 expansion added fitness facilities and an expanded daycare. The offices of Calgary Jewish Federation are located in the building, which also rents office space to several community organizations and services.

Promotional material often refers to the JCC, the "program and service arm of the Calgary Jewish Community Council" as a community living room. From its earliest inception, the facility has regularly hosted events and programs for – and with – a wide range of organizations, including Jewish Family Service, Canadian Mental Health Association, and the Canadian Red Cross. The JCC itself offers a wide range of cultural, commemorative and educational programs, and the auditorium and other spaces are frequently rented out for community events. In 2020, the facility was renamed Paperny Family JCC.

SCOPE AND CONTENT:

The fonds consists of minutes, correspondence and reports regarding the Calgary JCC, as well as programming and publicity material.

Also included are a 1988 Centre Board list, the Calgary JCC 2013 and 2016 Annual General Meeting booklets, and a logo-printed Calgary JCC envelope.

Also included are T-shirts from various community organizations and events, collected for a display called The Clothesline Project, a commemorative book from a 2013 event called Shalom/Salam, and annotated posters from a production of "Lies My Father Told Me".

These events, sometimes held at the Beth Tzedec Synagogue or other locations, include Yom Hazikaron (Israeli Remembrance Day) and Yom Ha'atzmaut (Israeli Independence Day), as well as events organized by the Holocaust Education Committee. Yom Hashoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day) programs were organized by the Centre until c2006[?], and then taken on by Calgary Jewish Community Council / Calgary Jewish Federation. Also included is material from a 1988 memorial to the athletes killed in Munich at the 1988 Winter Olympics, and a 1993 "Thanks to Scandinavia".
