ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:

National Council of Jewish Women was originally founded in Chicago in 1893, and National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW) of Canada was formed in Toronto in 1897, with the motto "Faith and Humanity". In 1920 Calgary became the third Canadian city to establish a National Council of Jewish Women section; the 15 original members elected Sarah Zemans as its president.

The early years of the Calgary Section, locally referred to as Council, were devoted to community assistance, and projects ranged from English classes to support for the Jewish needy. Members actively co-operated with the existing organizations in Calgary, and also raised considerable sums for the Jewish Old Folks Home of Western Canada (in Winnipeg) and the Winnipeg Jewish Orphanage, both of which served the entire western Canadian Jewish community. Regular meetings generally included lectures on subjects of current interest, and Council was instrumental in the founding of a Sunday School for those children not attending the Talmud Torah (Hebrew School). An annual bazaar, most often held at the Al Azhar Temple, was Council's major fund raiser in its early days. A Junior section was added for younger women, and by the 1930s, Council had expanded its recipients to include non-Jewish projects like the Institute for the Blind, the Junior Red Cross, and a Mount Royal College Bursary fund, raising funds through concerts, teas and dances.

Council continued to support an increasingly diverse range of causes and organizations in both the Jewish and non-Jewish communities, from War Relief and mental health issues, to multiple scholarships and bursaries, the Friendship Club (for seniors) and child care programs. Affiliate organizations included the Calgary Allied Arts Council, Calgary Association for Retarded Children, Calgary Jewish Women's Federation, Canadian Cancer Society, John Howard Society, Local Council of Women and United Nations Association. Many of Council's programs were part of initiatives promoted through the national organization, such as the Israeli Family Counselling Association and Soviet Jewry activism. Occasionally there was a local project that became a national initiative, like *TODAY ... and maybe tomorrow:* questions of Jewish survival, a simulation exercise created for the National organization's 1971 biennial convention. Involvement with local concerns, particularly those with wider implications such as the Alberta Government's Committee on Tolerance and Understanding, struck in the wake of the Keegstra hate-speech trial in 1984, was generally written up in the *National Newsletter* published by National Council of Jewish Women of Canada.

In 1952, in order to supplement the funds raised through the collection of dues and its other events and activities, Council began running a thrift store, Bargain Bazaar, in rented premises on 7th Avenue South East. Donations were solicited from the larger Jewish community, and Council members sorted and priced the merchandise for sale in the shop. Annual receipts returned to the organization ranged from \$2400 – 2800 through its first decade of operation, and in 1965 the store moved to a larger location on 1st SW. In 1960 Council was involved with the establishment of the Calgary Jewish Family Service Bureau (later, Jewish Family Service Calgary), and decided to inaugurate an annual large-scale fundraiser.

Using a model established some years earlier by the Montreal NCJW section, wherein admission to a major fundraising event was 'paid' through donations to an established fundraising mechanism, Calgary Council member donations of saleable items (or a cash equivalent) and of volunteer time to the Bargain Bazaar were carefully tracked, with minimum levels of both required to be able to purchase tickets to a formal evening fundraiser, the Angel's Ball. This dinner-dance became a highly-anticipated annual social event, strongly supported both within and beyond the Jewish community. Elaborate themes included 'My Blue Heaven', 'Gay Paree', 'Mythical Magic' 'Roman Holiday', and 'Diamonds and Denims'. The Angel's Ball continued until 1976.

National Council of Jewish Women Calgary Section had many branches over the years, including Mozah Zemans, Evening, Sicha, Eunice Bloom, Bertha Segall, Career Girls, Women's Issues and "Junior Councilettes". Members participated in the activities of their own branch as well as Calgary Section as a whole, especially in the operation of the Bargain Bazaar thrift store (1952- c1978) and the coordination of the Angel's Ball, as well as the operation of the Judaica and gift shop, The Glass Door, which Council ran in the Calgary Jewish Community Centre (1982-2004). Many also participated in the Council Choir, which was conducted for over 30 years by Edythe Pearlman. In addition Calgary Council members attended and hosted regional and national conventions, and several members also served the national organization, including Jenny Belzberg, Clarice Chodak, Gert Cohos, Pauline Fox, Muriel Kovitz, Myra Paperny, Florence Switzer, Mozah Zemans.

In 1976 an unsuccessful attempt was made to restructure National Council of Jewish Women Calgary Section, replacing the traditional executive positions with a steering committee. Regular Council meetings had ceased by the late 1980s, and attempts to revive interest in the organization were unsuccessful. Volunteers continued to run the Judaica shop until 2004, using the proceeds to fund projects in the name and spirit of NCJW.

The fonds consists of minutes, correspondence, financial statements, annual reports, membership lists, programming material, invitations and mailings, programs and newsletters regarding the activities of National Council of Jewish Women Calgary Section.
